In the month of January, it is our tradition at DPC to gather food for the **Germantown HELP** Food Pantry, and this January we will carry on with this mission to help feed the hungry in Montgomery County.



Please bring nonperishable food items to the church each week, as there is usually a great need, and your help is essential to make the biggest impact.

The items that are most helpful to the pantry are: peanut butter, jelly, cereal, tuna, canned chicken, canned vegetables, beans and soup, pasta,



and pasta sauce. These items are given to each family in need of emergency food assistance on the list weekly, so make sure that the size of the food you provide is appropriate, i.e. 1-pound box of pasta. Dessert items and condiments (ketchup, mustard, BBQ sauce, salsa, etc.) are included in the weekly deliveries and are always welcome.
